### The CME/CE Committee needs new members NOW!

SFCP needs **two new members** of the CME/CE Committee to help oversee fulfilling the requirements of the two agencies (APsaA and APA) that accredit our programs. The CME/CE Committee provides a vital function for SFCP by educating members about accreditation requirements – not a glamorous job, but a very necessary one. Hours vary depending on the number of courses requesting CME/CE approval.

SFCP is one of the few organizations in Northern California that provides continuing education credit for psychoanalytically oriented programs. This is an important benefit for our members and for other mental health clinicians in the community.

#### Who we need:

- 1) The American Psychoanalytic Association now welcomes any SFCP mental health clinician member (Analyst, Associate Member or Community Member) to be the local clinician facilitating the functioning of SFCP's CME program. The liaison person needs to be familiar with good psychoanalytic programming and CME requirements.
- 2) The American Psychological Association prefers a psychologist to oversee SFCP's CE program that provides continuing education credits to psychologists and masters level clinicians.

Some financial compensation is available for consultation fees and travel expenses to attend APsaA's annual Winter Meeting.

#### Report from the Chair of the San Francisco Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Training Program (SF-PPTP)

As the 2022-23 academic year winds down, the **San Francisco Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Training Program (SF-PPTP)** has much to celebrate. This year, 44 psychotherapy trainees were enrolled in our Tuesday evening-curriculum, taught by 35 dedicated instructors, and this month we celebrated nine new graduates: **John Connor Barnhart**, **MD**; **Zoe Barnow**, **PsyD**; **Kimberly Benton**, **MD**; **John Cruz**, **MD**; **Cynthia He**, **MD**, **PhD**; **Fei Hu**, **LMFT**; **Alison Hwong**, **MD**, **PhD**; **Ying Li**, **MD**, **PhD**; and **Blair McElroy**, **LCSW**, **MSW**.

This group of graduates was honored — alongside graduates from the Child and Adolescent PPTP (CAPPTP) and Palo Alto PPTP (PAPPTP) — at the June 3 graduation ceremony for SFCP's Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Education Division. Special thanks go to **Louis Roussel**, whose talk, The Humble Arts of Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis, served as an inspirational and touching marker of the occasion. Each graduate also had a chance to speak personally, and their collective comments emphasized the significant meaning and community students find in SFCP's psychotherapy training programs.

The SF-PPTP leadership is proud of the program's contribution to the Bay Area psychoanalytic community and to SFCP. Many of our trainees have gone on to practice, teach, and supervise psychoanalytic psychotherapy around the Bay Area. Many have remained engaged members of SFCP, including a significant number who have chosen to enter SFCP's Psychoanalytic Training Program. Currently, for example, 20 of SFCP's 49 current candidates, including three members of our incoming class, are former SF-PPTP trainees.

As SF-PPTP heads into its thirteenth academic year, it continues to evolve in important ways. **Lara Weyland**, program chair from 2021-23, led us in charting a three-year transition from the remote learning necessitated by the pandemic back to in-person learning. In Fall 2022, new equipment allowed us to re-open 444 Natoma on Tuesday nights for all who wished to attend classes in person, while others continued to attend remotely. It has been a particular pleasure to witness several cohorts with strong inperson attendance. Starting in Fall 2023, classes will be fully in person for Year 1 trainees, with all classes fully in person by Fall 2024.

I also am pleased to report that, beginning this coming year, our Curriculum Committee, under the able leadership of Chair **Ruth Simon**, is introducing new first-year coursework focused on the fundamental elements of psychoanalytic stance, on the history of psychoanalytic ideas, and on psychoanalytic understanding of sociocultural processes and their roles in the practice of psychoanalytic psychotherapy.

Interest in our program remains strong among early-career professionals. Applicants for Fall 2023 include twelve psychiatrists (including residents from California Pacific Medical Center, San Mateo Medical Center, Stanford, UC Davis, and UC San Francisco), five marriage and family therapists, three psychologists, three psychiatric nurse practitioners, and one palliative care physician. With this many applications to review, the work of the SF-PPTP Admissions Committee has been formidable. The program is fortunate that this effort has been ably led by our Admissions Chair, **Lucas Broster**, himself an SF-PPTP graduate and incoming candidate! Acceptance emails went out last week and we are looking forward to our thirteenth consecutive year of full SF-PPTP classes.

As this academic year concludes, I would like to offer special recognition to **Maria Longuemare**, who is stepping off of the SF-PPTP guidance committee to tend to her other crucial roles at SFCP. Maria was one of the founders of the program in 2011. She served as Feedback and Evaluation Chair from 2011–2015; as Program Chair from 2015–2022; and as Supervision Chair from 2021–23. Her leadership, vision, and creativity have been central in making SF-PPTP the program it is today, and we are delighted that she will continue to teach our second-year trainees this coming academic year.

I also would like to recognize **Katherine Fraser**, another SF-PPTP founder who has served both as the program's Student Advisor and as Sacramento-Davis Liaison. Katherine has been instrumental in building our ties to the Sacramento / Davis community and we are touched and honored that many students have journeyed to San Francisco each Tuesday night for two years to participate in our program!

So many others deserve recognition for the hard work and passion they have dedicated to keeping SF-PPTP vibrant. **Lara Weyland** continues to work tirelessly for the program, serving as Associate Chair and as Supervision Chair as she also continues to teach and supervise. As our current Student Advisor, **Jessica Ferranti** continues to mentor many of our students as they navigate our program and their (often early) careers.

Though space does not allow us to name them all here, we are deeply indebted to the 35 instructors who taught Tuesday evening courses this year and to the 142 members of our community who serve as SF-PPTP supervisors. And our program could not function were it not for the robust and dedicated support we receive from Educational Program Coordinator **Tina Phu**; Communications Manager **Aaron Chow**; Membership and Administrative Services Manager **Nicole Lee**; Facility Assistant **Dimitri Jenkins**; librarian **Rashmita Sriram**; and Administrative Director **Marcia Hodges**.






#### Sarah Rosenbaum, MD, MPH

#### Christine Tam, LCSW





#### JOHN MICHAEL DE VERA CRUZ, MD






#### BLAIR MCELROY, LCSW, MSW


